A. Consideration of Oversight Board RESOLUTION Approving the Oversight Board Minutes of February 26, 2015

Board Member Scholink indicated that a correction to the resolution signer needed to be changed from the Vice Chair to the Chair.

Motion to adopt the Oversight Board **Resolution** as amended, approving the Oversight Board Minutes of February 26, 2015 was made by Board Member Bodem, seconded by Board Member Nakamura. AYES: Board Members Miles, Nakamura, Scholink, Bodem, Addleman. NOES: None. ABSENT: Board Member Parker.

ABSTAIN: Board Member McPherson. Motion carried.

B. Update on City of Seaside v. Sand City Litigation

Board Member Bodem distributed a "confidential" memo to the Board from Attorney Brent Hawkins of Best, Best & Krieger regarding the status of the Seaside v. Sand City litigation. He requested that the Board return the memo due to its 'confidential' nature. Following the review of the memo, Chair McPherson thanked Staff for providing the Board with an update.

C. Update on Status of Long Range Property Management Plan

Board member Bodem reported that the Long Range Property Management Plan is currently being re-drafted by the City's former Interim City Administrator Kelly Morgan. The LRPMP is now with the City Attorney for his review and results should be ready with the next 1-2 months.

AGENDA ITEM 7, PRESENTATION

- A. Presentation by Cheryl Murase of HdL Coren & Cone on conversion of Local Agency Oversight Board to a County-wide Board and process regarding Supplemental Educational Revenue Augmentation Fund (SERAF) Repayment
 - 1) Consideration of Oversight Board Resolution approving the Successor Agency's Repayment of a Loan owed to the Former Redevelopment Agency's Low and Moderate Income Housing Fund in accordance with Health & Safety Code Sections 34171(d)(1)(G) and 34191.4(b)(1)

Cheryl Murase from HdL Coren and Cone addressed the transition reporting that Governor Brown announced his proposed State budget measures for fiscal year 2015-16. As the sixth ROPS cycle is pending completion, it became clear that there are different interpretations of redevelopment dissolution and the governor is trying to resolve any conflicts. A revision regarding redevelopment plan limits will no longer be considered and will be abolished. Should a redevelopment project have a plan limitation that would cause the RPPTF revenue to stop, the Successor Agency would continue to receive RPPTF revenues until their debt is fully resolved. In LA County, the County Counsel did not agree with the DOF's interpretation of the legislation and still applying limits.

Chair McPherson received clarification regarding agency plan limits from Ms. Murase who explained that bond issues typically have an indenture requirement for a capture of those revenues should it have a potential to hit their limit. DOF took the position that there are no limits and therefore does not pose a concern. Local agencies position is that the County is currently keeping track of limits and may potentially be a problem. This is not an issue in the County of Monterey as it is with other counties in the State.

Another proposed amendment to the State budget would be the transition of a single ROPS filing each year rather than twice a year. This annual ROPS filing would be due by March of each year and will commence beginning with ROPS 16-17, and will need Oversight Board approval by February next year. Legislation currently dictates that the Oversight Board will go to the County level by July 2016. A ROPS item may be amended as long as it has been approved by October 1st. DOF is allowing for corrections and adjustments.

Chair McPherson commented that the Sand City Successor Agency will approve a ROPS in the fall, and another in February 2016 as Sand City's Oversight Board.

Ms. Murase added that the County-wide board will need to be appointed by July 15th of next year. If there are vacancies, the Governor may appoint a member. The County-wide board will be comprised of seven members and will consist of one member appointed by the County Board of Supervisors, a City selection committee, an independent Special District selection committee, by the County Superintendent of Schools or the County Board of Education, the Chancellor of the California Community Colleges, a member of the public to be appointed by the County Board of Supervisors, and one member appointed by the recognized employee organization representing the largest number of successor agency employees in the County. If any position remains vacant for more than 60 days, the Governor may appoint a member to fill that position(s).

Ms. Murase reported that at the previous Oversight Board meeting, the Board approved a ROPS (15-16A) that was submitted to the Department of Finance (DOF) for approval that contained a request for repayment of SERAF loans, which were loans that the agency borrowed from the housing fund to make SERAF payment obligations for 2009 and 2010. As part of the repayment of the SERAF obligations, the Oversight Board needs to approve the attached repayment schedule. The repayment schedule is based on projections of future RPPTF revenues, based on assessed values reported by the County back in August 2014. It does not include any supplemental revenues or past delinquencies, and is a conservative projection of revenues that will be available for the agency to pay back towards the housing fund. Repayment of the SERAF loan is dictated by statute and the calculation is based on the residual revenues that were distributed to the taxing entities

back in 2013, comparing it to the subsequent ROPS. This would be from the period of July 2012 to June 2013. The Successor Agency did not ask for the payment at that time, and is now making this request. The original request of \$300,000 is now \$98,000, as reflected on page 23 of the packet. Ms. Murase explained to the Board how the figure was calculated.

There were no additional questions from the Board.

Motion to adopt the Oversight Board **Resolution** approving the Successor Agency's Repayment of a Loan owed to the Former Redevelopment Agency's Low and Moderate Income Housing Fund in accordance with Health & Safety Code Sections 34171(d)(1)(G) and 34191.4(b)(1) was made by Board Member Addleman, seconded by Board Member Scholink. AYES: Board Members McPherson, Miles, Nakamura, Scholink, Bodem, Addleman. NOES: None. ABSENT: Board Member Parker. ABSTAIN: None. Motion carried.

Chair McPherson summarized the actions taken regarding the Long Range Property Management Plan, and the possible course of action should the amended LRPMP not be ready for Oversight Board approval. Ms. Murase commented that should DOF not approve the amended LRPMP by January 2016, then disposition of properties would revert to the rules that were in law prior to AB 1484. Additional clarification will be provided to the Board following further research. Chair McPherson commented that the LRPMP is presently the outstanding business for Oversight Board approval other than the upcoming ROPS. It would be up to Staff and the City to inform the Board the best approach regarding the LRPMP before the Board is disbanded.

Background

The Redevelopment Dissolution Law allows for administrative budgets up to \$250,000 annually for smaller Successor Agencies like Sand City. The amended administrative budget was approved by the Sand City SA at its regular meeting on September 15, 2015.

The attached ROPS covers the period from January 1, 2016 through June 30, 2016. The Successor Agency is requesting funding for ½ of the annual bond payments, the remainder of the proposed budget for administrative services, and the Successor Agency is requesting a payment towards the Supplemental Educational Revenue Augumentation Fund (SERAF) obligation, which totals a request for \$550,087.00

The breakdown is as follows:

The administrative budget was previously approved by the Successor Agency for the full fiscal year 2015-2016. When it was presented to the Oversight Board, they approved the first six months with direction to staff to reduce the budget for the remaining 6 months. Due to the costs of required services and staffing needed, staff reduced the remaining 6 months total by \$ 17,225.00.

There is \$99,237 being requested as a partial payment towards the SERAF obligation. This was requested in the previous ROPS and DOF denied it in the meet and confer process. According to our outside Counsel Brent Hawkins and our HdL Consultant Cheryl Murase, this is not legal or authorized for DOF to deny, so under Cheryl's direction we are putting it back on the current ROPS.
