AGENDA ITEM 4, COMMUNICATIONS:

- The additional written communications distributed to the City Council this A. evening included a memo from the City Administrator (item 10-A).
- The floor was opened at 7:06 p.m. for oral communications from the public. В. STEVE WILSON (Resident): Expressed his concern about the continued dust and dirt on the streets caused by the construction at Graniterock. The streets are not structured for this intense activity. How will this degree of truck traffic mix if a Home Depot is built near their site? Mr. Wilson also referenced an outstanding issue he has with the East Dunes area. There are good homes here now, and certain businesses just don't belong. He would also like someone to enforce permits and get yards cleaned up.

REVEREND KAST: Was at the opening of the Ream/Meadows business center and complimented the aesthetics of the building.

Arts Chair Todd Kruper described the new arts display in the Chambers from the Monterey International School students. Mayor Pendergrass announced that the application for agenda item 8-B was withdrawn and item 9-A on the art wall was pulled from the agenda.

AGENDA ITEM 7, PRESENTATION(S):

- A. Presentation and discussion of coastal erosion study by Haro-Kasunich & Associates. JOHN KASUNICH (Principal): Presented his findings and recommendations regarding building setbacks required to satisfy the City's Local Coastal Plan (LCP) policy regarding coastal erosion building setbacks. In December 2002 the Monterey Bay coastline suffered significant wave battering due to storms. The Environmental Impact Report (EIR) for the proposed desal plant has been updated to reflect coastal retreat that may have occurred since the 1989 Moffat and Nichol report was released. Mr. Kasunich addressed questions raised by the City Council.
- B. Presentation and discussion of preliminary redevelopment plans for the Robinette Site. AL SAROYAN (Developer) described the project, site plan, and building design proposed for this project. The construction will be in two phases and parking issues were discussed. In response to a question by Councilmember Kruper, Mr. Saroyan said there will be a public square area and an area around the back with landscaping for a park-like setting. He is working with the City Attorney on the Disposition and Development Agreement (DDA) and a draft should be available soon.

AGENDA ITEM 8, PUBLIC HEARING(S):

A. Associate Planner Pooler presented the **City RESOLUTION** for an Amendment and Time Extension to Conditional Use Permit 426 for Brad Harber of Harber Concrete Services authorizing continued operation of a concrete business within an existing fenced yard at the end of Fir Avenue (APN 011-123-003 & 017). The project qualifies as a categorical exemption under State CEQA Guidelines, Section 15301, and is within a non-coastal Manufacturing (M) zoning district. This year-long lease has expired and staff is recommending a one year extension, with the option of 90-day extensions subject to City Council approval and prior to the South of Tioga project commencing.

The project qualifies as a categorical exemption under State CEQA Guidelines, Section 15301, and is within a non-coastal Planned Mixed-Use (MU-P) zoning district.

City Engineer Kulakow reported that the civic center work is commencing and utility issues have been addressed. Community Development Director Matarazzo, City Administrator and Mayor will meet with AMBAG tomorrow to discuss population growth. Staff would like the City to have unconstrained population estimates that are consistent with the General Plan.

A. City Administrator Morgan presented his preliminary review of Sand City's revenue situation. The City's revenues are dependent on the State budget to some degree. Statistics and revenue sources were discussed, including reference to the proposed lawsuit by the City of Cerritos against the State.

A list of "Next Steps for Budget Process" was handed out to the Councilmembers. Options to generate revenue were also discussed including the intended sale of the Robinette site.
