AGENDA ITEM 7, OLD BUSINESS

- A. Progress Report on Public Works Projects & Programs by City Engineer, Community Development Director & City Administrator. The City Administrator reported that Sand City is involved with some very major, complicated economic competition with the surrounding cities. At the Mayor's urging the City Administrator had contacted Costco and spoke with the regional representative about the possibility of expanding and adding a gas station. Currently staff is reviewing the site plan for the Sand Dollar shopping center. There are two pad sites that have not been developed in the Sand Dollar shopping center. The City did receive the interest only payment from John King. The City Engineer stated the lighting of the bike trail should be ready to go out for bid at the next meeting or the first meeting in November. Community Development Director reported that staff is wrapping up their responses to comments on the draft environmental impact report on the water supply project.
- B. Progress Report on "South of Tioga" Redevelopment Project Area.
 - Complications on the South of Tioga project will be discussed in Closed Session. The City Administrator explained that staff has been working with Don Orosco and moving forward with the mixed use project. Staff did meet with Lowe's and they want to be considered for the South of Tioga area. The Agency may want to consider a major retail store as a possible tenant at that site, with the water situation always a consideration. The developer has stated that he has reached an impasse with one of the property owners and he has asked the Redevelopment Agency to start the process in authorizing an appraisal of that property.
- C. Consideration of RESOLUTION Authorizing a Service Agreement with John Hanna to perform appraisal work related to a private parcel (APN 011-122-010) in the South of Tioga Redeployment Project area.

A proposal was not received, therefore this item was not discussed.

AGENDA ITEM 8A, NEW BUSINESS

The City Administrator recommended that the City hold off for awhile and see if the City can get some Grant Funding for the Hazard Mitigation Plan. The Community Developer suggested that the City apply for a Planning and Technical Assistance (PTA) grant because the expense associated with the Hazard Mitigation Plan is not in the current year's budget. The Planning and Technical Assistance grant from the State is not activated again until May 2005. There is a requirement of the grant that the City receive 3 bids before they will award the grant. City Council consensus to continue this item and seek grant funding.
