October 19th Music Event Preparation: Each Committee member gave updates on their areas of responsibility. The poster, postcard, and t-shirt art was received and approved by the Committee. The designated colors will be black on yellow paper; the t-shirts will be a white image on black material. It was determined that postcards will be provided to Sand City open studio participants, Group Show participants, Sand City residents, and specified dignitaries. Access Monterey Peninsula (AMP), the City of Monterey public broadcast television station, will have producer Phyllis Davies cover the event by video. Stephen Vagnini of SLV Music Management has signed the contract (\$2,500 budget) confirming the musical acts, stage, sound equipment. However the Big Sur Natives were paid separately (\$500). Greg arranged for the San Francisco "mummers" to perform (\$500). Coast Weekly will have an interview with Chair, Todd Kruper, and will be featured in their publication the week of the event.

The vendors have confirmed their attendance: Gil's Gourmet Gallery, Big Sur Coast Foods, Casa Linda, Maido Catering, Seaside/Sand City Chamber of Commerce, The Art Initiative of Big Sur, and Clay Oven was replaced by Indian Summer. The only charge to the vendors is the \$50 one-time Sand City business license fee; however, they are responsible for providing their own water and electrical needs.

The following Sand City Studios will be open: Deakins Studio, Stefani Esta Studio, Norman Foster Studio, Hawthorne Art Warehouse, Sand City

Sculpture, Leonardini Studio, Slautterback Studio, Suskah Studio, The Informalists (Johnny Apodaca, Cyndra Bradford, Jeff Smith), and the Group Show at the new Hawthorne building.

At the September 30th meeting, Police Chief Klein led the discussion of the proposed event infrastructure and logistics. This discussion included public safety issues (policing, parking, and street closures), setup, and emergency vehicle access. His department is also providing the "sandwich boards" for the open studio artists to use for a poster display outside of their studio.
