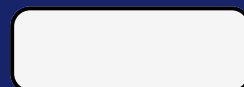

CA Incident Based Reporting (CIBRS)

Crime reporting in the US began in the 1930's, with uniform definitions for seven crimes, referred to as "Part 1" crimes. They included: murder, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, larceny-theft, and motor vehicle theft. The crime of arson was not added until 1979.

In the 1980's, the FBI knew the Uniform Crime Reporting model required revision, to include the new types of crimes and methods of victimization that existed, and the National Incident Based Reporting System (NIBRS) was born. The *California* Incident Based Reporting System (CIBRS) transition required extensive redesign of record management system products, and training.

The Sand City Police Department achieved CIBRS certification in August of 2022.
